## PREFACE.

Thirty years of interesting study examining many and various town, county, State, church, family Bible, and other records (at all times taking notes), have enabled me to compile therefrom the within matter, which I hope will give as much pleasure to some of the other descendants of the early settlers of Long Island as the gathering of it has given me.

As "to err is human," I must ask indulgence for errors, and offer to endeavor to correct them if brought to my notice.

Several pages in the fore part of the book are devoted to deeds, wills and records of the early Powells, with some accounts of the coming of the first Thomas, progenitor of all the rest.

The Powell genealogies follow in the order of the *first Thomas*. Then, *Powell* descendants of his oldest son; then, Powell descendants of his second oldest son; then, Powell descendants of his third oldest son, and so on through the Powells.

Three of the children of Thomas Powell having married into the Willets family, I have deemed it proper that the genealogy of the Willets family should come next. Edmund Titus' genealogy fol-

In 1640. Mary Williams, widow of Thomas<sup>1</sup> lived  
north side of the plains; a memorial of her by Clement  
Willets says, "she was a worthy woman and justly  
deserves our grateful remembrance, to me she was  
like a mother—and not to me only, but to many of

her poor neighbors also, who felt the benefit of her bountiful hand. She was very careful not to let her left hand know what her right hand did."

The original deed from the Indians to Robert Williams for the Plains in Oysterbay, was executed on the 20 of May, 1648.

Robert appears to have resided a part of the time in Hempstead, was living there in 1659. The Indian Deed for Oysterbay was executed in 1653 to Robert Williams and others, he was one of the patentees of Dosori's, O. B. in 1668. Some accounts say that he was born in Wales, and was a brother of Richard Williams, of Huntington, and a near relative of Roger Williams, of R. I., all of which may be true; I have not seen any of it verified, suffice it he was our Ancestor, and disposed of 1-3 of his property in Jericho to his wife's sister, Mary (Washburne), widow of Richard Willets; in 1667 — thus paving the way for many pleasant Ancestral homes in that vicinity.

Flushing minutes say he had certificate of clearness from other marriage engagements from both Rhode Island and Philadelphia meetings.

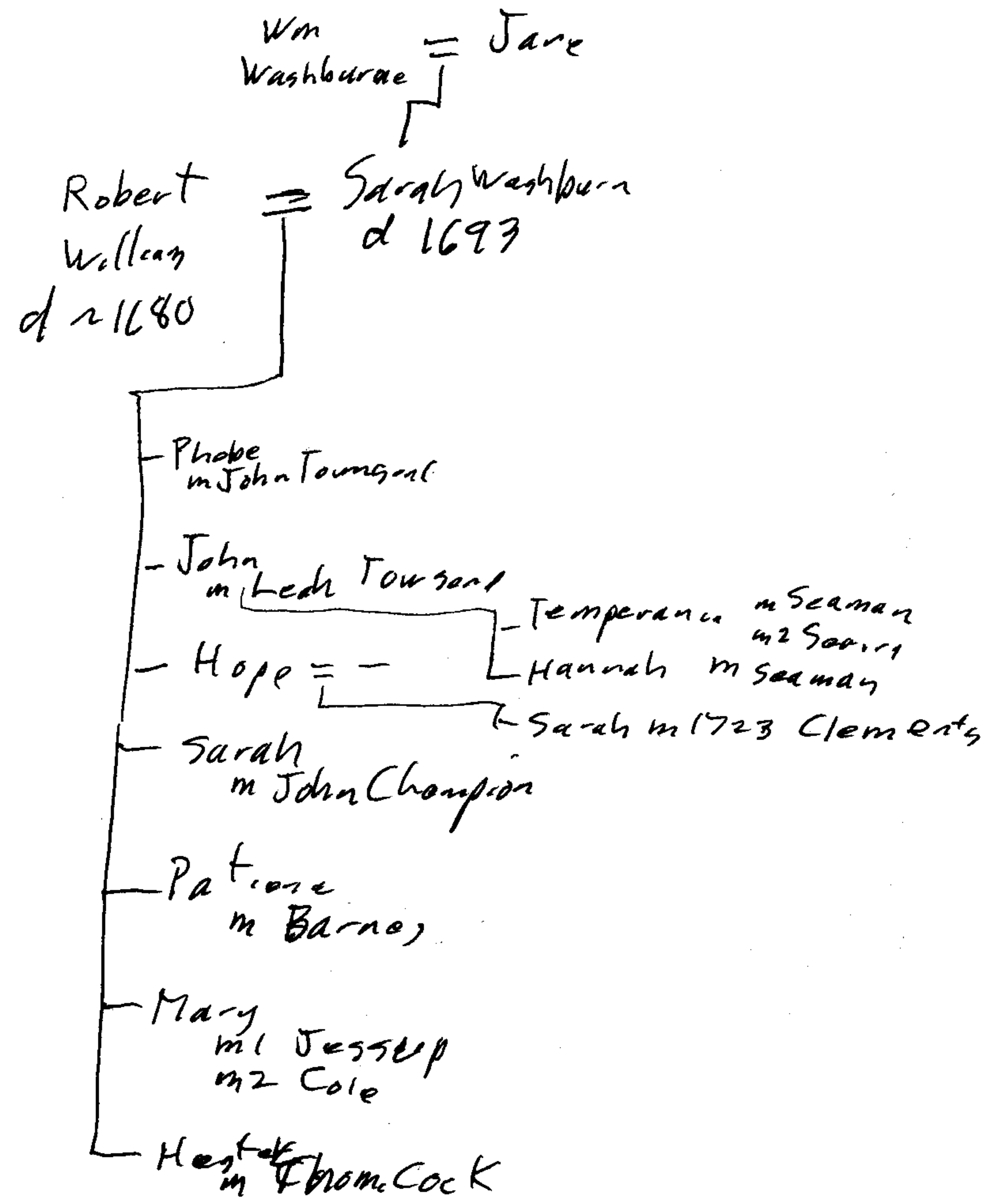
