NEW JERSEY MARRIAGE LICENSES 1727-34 (with additions to 1751)

UNDER THIS caption there is in the office of the Secretary of State at Trenton a volume containing two hundred and fifty-four printed pages each containing the records of two marriage licenses granted by the Governor of the Province of New Jersey. A copy of the first entry follows, the words in italics being filled in by hand by Samuel Bustill, Provincial Deputy Secretary.

Be it Remembered, That on the *Twenty Ninth* Day of *March* in the *Thirteenth* Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE, King of Great Britain &c, Anno Domini, One Thousand, Seven Hundred and *Twenty Seven* LICENCE of Marriage was granted by *his Excellency William Burnet Esq'r* Governour of the Provinces of New-Jersey and New-York, &c unto *Andrew Conerow of ye County of Burlington, Taylor* of the one Party; AND *Rebecca Arnold of ye Same County—Spinster* of the other Party.

Given under the said Governour's Hand and Prerogative-Seal of the Province of New-Jersey Aforesaid, and dated the Day and Year above-written.

On the back of most of these sheets, the pages being numbered 1½, 2½, etc., are from three to ten briefer entries of licenses granted from 1734 to 1751. Thus there is in the entire book

an account of well over two thousand early New Jersey marriage licenses.

In Volume 22 of the New Jersey Archives a brief record of these licenses will be found, but such details as the town of residence of both parties, the occupation of the prospective groom and the marital status (whether widow or spinster) of the bride are not given. In not a few instances the record supplies the name of the bride's father, information not found in the printed volume. The latter contains numerous errors and a few omissions.

For these reasons it has been considered well worth while to make available through these pages all of the details found in the original, including the additional entries down to 1751. The following copy has been carefully checked back to the original record and is believed to be absolutely correct. In some cases the handwriting is difficult to decipher and alternative interpretations are given in brackets. It might also be mentioned that the entries are not in strict chronological order, indicating that the Deputy Secretary sometimes allowed items to accumulate before being entered in the record. For this reason it is in a few cases impossible to be certain of the year where there is a discrepancy between the calendar year and the year of the reign of the ruling British Sovereign. It should be remembered that the dates are those of the license, and not necessarily of the marriage; also that under the old style dating the new year did not start until March 25, so that a license dated Feb. 9, 1727 was 1728 according to our system of dating, or 1727/8, as it was frequently written to avoid misunderstanding.

JOHN CROES (1762-1832) is perhaps best known as the first Protestant Episcopal Bishop of New Jersey, having served in that office from 1815 until his death. His first charge was at Swedesborough, in Gloucester County, 1790-1801. The remainder of his life, from 1801 to 1832, he spent as rector of Christ Church, New Brunswick. During the years 1801-1808 Bishop Croes also headed the grammar school associated with
