Introductory

Stanley K. Walborn; Historian on Early Pioneer WALBORN FAMILIES, delivered the following address at Walborn Reunion held at Hershey Park, Hershey, Pa. in 1937:

"Our Ancestors since the 17th. Century" By Stanely K. Walborn Genealogist.

The history and legend of the Pennsylvania Germans are treasures now simply because they have been treasured. They have been received, valued and transmitted by men and women who themselves are attune with heroism, who felt an unfeigned gratitude for a glorious past and a resolute concern that that glory should not perish.

The citizen, especially the young citizen who knows the backgrounds, has an infinitely better understanding of what he sees each day. To him a building is not a mere physical fact, a social practice is not simply so much activity. He sees the lively idea of the past dead behind each creation. He sees a process as if in a moving picture. He lives a larger, deeper life than those about him whose range of vision lacks this third dimension, and who are blind to the inner view.

It is the legend of the Pennsylvania Germans of that company which landed in New York in the early summer of 1710, and of which John Adam Walborn was one, that there were over three thousand, and that they made up the largest body of emigrants coming to this country at any one time in the colonial period.

The Pilgrim Fathers were not the only company who sought in this new western world their freedom to worship God. The fact is that if ever a body of emigrants came to America from under the hand of the oppressor-such was the plight of these Palatines, and if ever the thought of religious liberty constrained men to leave their native land for hoped-for freedom in America, such hope was powerful with these children of the Palatinate.

So in 1709, we find these people tired and weary of the ravages and destruction of the European Wars, leaving their native land in the search of freedom in America.

By the fall of 1709 about 14,000 of these Palatines had reached London, having traveled by boat down the Rhine and then to Rotterdam, Holland. The trip was a tedious one, due to the many stops made en-route, and required considerable time. Before they reached Rotterdam most of their meager resources had been exhausted, and by the time they reached London most of them were destitute and entirely dependent upon the government for subsistence.

While the Palatines were yet in London and the authorities were perplexed as to the best way to dispose of them; there came to England an important delegation from the province of New York. The chief persons in the delegation were Peter Schuyler, mayor of Albany, the Col., Nicholson, one of her Majest's officers in America. Their mission was to urge by personal presence and speech, - more urgently than was possible to any written appeal, the need of more generous measures on the part of the home government for the defence of the province against the attacks made by the French and their allied Indians. In the recent; past attacks of these foes had been very persistent and severe, while the colonists felt that the government of England had neglected to afford them all the support and aid which were their due. Col., Schuyler by a happy and inventive thought conceived the idea that the cause would be greatly furthered by taking to England some Indian Chiefs and exhibiting them in their barbaric costume, knowing that the movements of nations are often caused by the veriest trifles. He succeeded in inducing five Sachems of the Mohawks to go with him, and speedily found that he had contrived a very efficient scheme.

Now the connection between this Indian Embassy and the Palatines is found in a circumstance of which the government had made small account, but which exercised a great and determining influence on their fortunes. It so happened that while these Chiefs were in London, they came in contact with the Palatines. In their walks in the outskirts of London - they saw the unbelievable condition of the houseless and homeless people, and one of the Indian representatives unsolicitedly and voluntarily pre-

sent the Queen a tract of his land in Schoharie, New York, for the use and benefit of the distressed Germans.

There is an uncertainty as to the precise date of their departure from England, Conrad Weiser's Reminiscences relate "about Christmas - Day 1709, we embarked in 10 shiploads with about 4,000 souls were sent to America." The royal instructions to the new Governor bear date - Jan. 20, 1710, and presumably were committed to him in London.

Towards the end of January then, we may suppose the largest of the immigrations to America in the Colonial era to have left the shores of England. The number of Palatines embarked must be set below the figures given by Weiser. In reality there were about 3,000 of them. However, their numbers were great enough to crowd the small ships of that day almost to the point of suffocation, and pitiful as the tale is, it brings no surprise to learn that nearly one-sixth of the whole number perished by the way. The voyage was longer than usual by reason of the heavy storms and contrary winds. From near the end of January until after the beginning of June, and for some until the end of July - these weary people were battling their way across the Atlantic. The crowded quarters, the foul air and insufficient food, made them easy prey of disease, so that every day witnessed the consignment of their dead into the sea. The mortality was terrible and just have covered the fleet as with the shadow of death. Hunter writes from New York on June 16, 1710, - "I arrived here two days ago. We want still three of the Palatine ships, and those that have arrived are in deplorable, sickly condition."

It had been the plan of Governor Hunter when he left England, that the Palatines were to be used in the manufacture of tar and other naval stores, but as the season of their establishment was well advanced into the late fall, no work on the trees was possible at that time of year and the first labors of the people had to be directed toward housing themselves for the winter. During that winter if we are to receive the statements of the Palatines themselves they suffered greatly from the severity of the cold and the insufficient supply of clothing from the Government.

After the failure on the part of the government to find suitable trees for the production and manufacture of the anticipated naval stores, they hailed the order to cease the work and for the people to shift for themselves, as a proclamation of freedom. They at once dispatched to Schoharie seven deputies to examine the land, deal with the Indians in the neighborhood and find best route for the people to take thither. The Palatines statement tells of the most hospitable treatment of the deputies by the Indians. The deputies entreated the Indians to give them permission to settle on the tract of land called Schorie. This the Indians readily granted. The migration of the people was in two companies. The first company was composed of fifty families, which as soon as possible after the return of the deputies, set out upon the journey.

Hardly was the toilsome journey over before a new and different trouble began, the tale of which beginning may best be told in their own words; - "Being arrived and almost settled, they received orders from the Governor not to go upon the land, and he who did so should be declared a rebel; this message sounded like thunder in their ears and surprised them beyond expression! However, after having seriously weighed matters among themselves, and finding no manner of likelihood of subsisting elsewhere but a certainty of perishing by hunger, cold etc; if they returned - they found themselves under the fatal necessity of hazarding the Governor's resentment, that being to all the more eligible than starving."

During this time the settlers suffered many privations. The barbarous people showed them no little kindness and out of their own scanty stores of maize gave freely to them. They broke ground enough in the spring to plant corn for use of the next year, but the first year their hunger was hardly endurable. The Indians showed them where to find many edible roots. Many of their feasts were of wild potatoes and ground beans.

The people had not long been in Schoharie and were still suffering through the privations incident to their new settlement, when the first of their troubles about their lands was put upon them. The Governor

meantime had granted patents to several persons at Albany and New York, who were spoken of as the five partners and they proceeded to assert their rights to the land which the Palatines occupied. They informed the poor people that they had obtained the land from the Governor and that all living upon it must buy or lease their holdings, and such as were unwilling to do either must leave the valley altogether. The reply of the Palatines was that the lands of Schoharie had been set apart for them by Queen Ann, and that now it was the King's lands and they could not agree with anybody about what was the King's. This was sufficiently explicit but not satisfactory and the five partners promptly made their appeal to the courts.

In 1717, we find that John Adam Walborn had taken the oath of allegiance and was a volunteer from Annsburg, in what was called the East Camp, located on the east side of the Hudson River about where the present site of where the city of Germantown, Dutchess County, now stands. He fought with the English against the French at Montreal and also in the defence of Albany.

In 1722 at a council with the Indians at Albany, the importance of which drew to its deliberations not only the newly appointed Governor Burnett of New York, but also Sir William Keith - the Governor of Pennsylvania. Keith became acquainted with the Palatine affairs. In whatever way Keith may have been informed he was moved to compassion for the distressed people, and offered them an asylum from all persecution, in his own province. Weiser says - "that he, hearing of the unrest of the Germans lost no time to inform them of the freedom and justice accorded to their countrymen in Pennsylvania." The experiences of the people, while in New York and the disposition of the authorities toward them were of such character that at least a third of the population readily embraced the first opportunity of the establishment beyond the jurisdiction of the colony in which they had found such troubles, and accordingly they descended the Schoharie for a few miles and then under the conduct of an Indian guide crossed the mountains southwestwardly to the upper waters of the Susquehanna. On the banks of this river they constructed canoes for the carriage of most of their number. The majority of the party floated southward in these canoes, while some of the men drove the horses and cattle on the land. The journey carried this band down the Susquehanna to the mouth of the Swatara, turning into this stream they followed its upward course, until in the region of hills and vales and fertile meadowlands where both the Swatara and the Tulpehocken have their rise, a sturdy people found at last the object of their journey and a place of permanent habitation in the land of the "Turtle Song" - the Tulpehocken Valley. To their first settlement they gave the name Heidelberg and thence sent back word to their friends at Schoharie of the prosperous issue of their journey.

By their steadiness, industry, frugality, religious habitudes and patriotic devotion to their new country, they not only established their own prosperity, but also won their way to the regard of the province, upon which their coming had brought unmeasured blessings. Of such influence and impression most weighty testimony is borne by no less competent a judge than Benjamin Franklin, who in 1776 testified before a committee of the British House of Commons that of the one hundred and sixty thousand whites in the Province of Pennsylvania about one third were Germans, and described them as - "a people who brought with them the greatest of all wealth - industry and integrity, and characters that had been superpoised and developed by the years of suffering and persecution."

The story of these Palatine folk in Pennsylvania and in New York is in itself a sufficient evidence that, when they came over sea, they brought with them the qualities and virtues which any land might be glad to welcome, and that, like men of other stock, the Puritan, Dutch, Huguenot etc; they conferred upon their new country blessings which it could not afford to lose.

Military Records During The Revolutionary War Period:

Within a half century after their settlement in the Tulpehocken Valley in 1723, many descendants of the first and second generation American born sons were engaged in the struggle for freedom for their homeland. A few cases may be overlooked as they may have joined separate troops elsewhere.

Records for those who saw service in the French & Indian Wars, Spanish & American War, Civil War, World War I, etc; are given reference under the particular family group.

Introductory

In 1725, the thirty-families of Tulpehocken Settlement met together to discuss their plans for a place in which to hold their religious meetings, and also a permanent site for their members. Along with their plans were expressions of a need for school for the instruction of their children.

One, John Page - the proprietor of Plumpton Manor had set aside seven acres of land to be used for the above purpose, and at their meeting an additional seven acres was donated by Adam, Christopher and John Leonard Rieth.

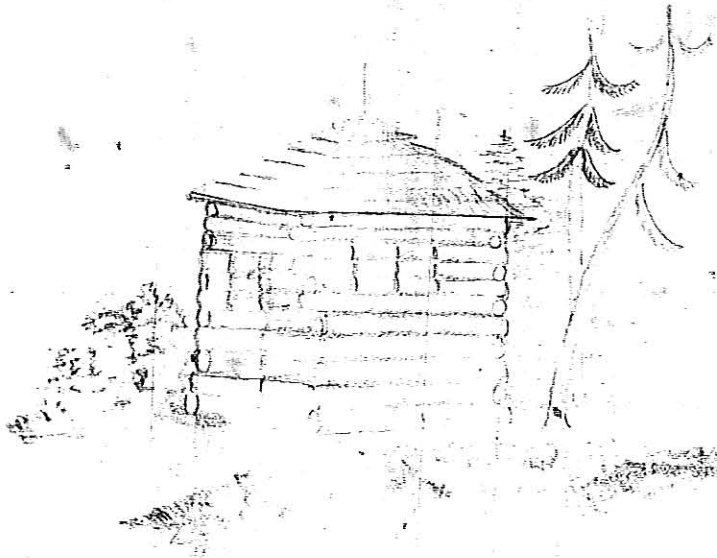
Then began the men, women and children to work on the Church's construction. The building made out of the crude logs and the pulpit was that of a huge round block, the base of a tree. Seats were split-logs with the inner hewens sides upper-most. With no fire-place, the members were obliged to warm themselves in winter by an out-side fire before attending services within. A large vault was built for safety beneath the earthen floor as a stock place for ammunition. Most often the pastor kept his old flint lock rifle in front of him as he preached. Thus the small band had to be constantly on guard of Indian attacks. The church, which took some five months in its construction, was completed in 1727.

This first church was built on a prominent elevation overlooking the Tulpehocken river and Mill Creek, and became called Rieth's or Zion's Church. This building remained standing in the corner of the cemetery at Stouchsburg until the latter part of the nineteenth century, when it was destroyed by fire.

In 1742, strife among the members of the church arose from the influences of the Moravian body, which took over the Church's Services. This early church became a free church, and was known as the Heidelberg Moravian Church until its disbandment in 1760.

The Lutherans and Reformed Members built in 1743, their new church, The Christ Church (Lutheran Later) on the west edge of Stouchsburg, Pa.

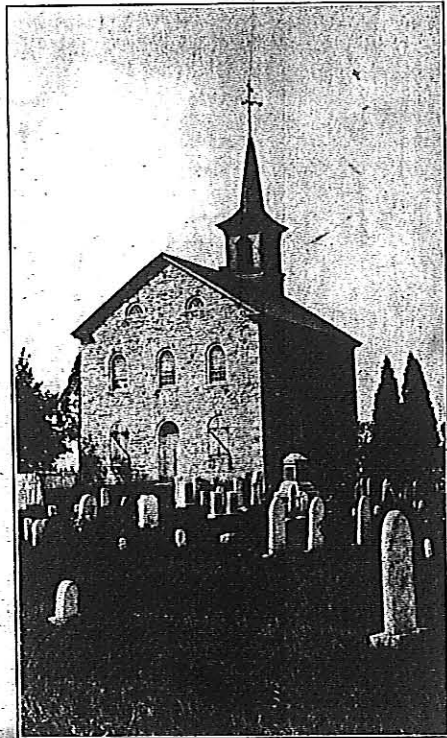
An early Historic Church erected by many of those Tulpehocken Settlers, which records have been transmitted, relaid and retained. It is in this same church yard, that many of the earlier Walborn ancestors and their direct descendants found their final resting place.

From this church's early registries have come the birth and baptismal records of the Walborn Families of those early years.

Among the records made in the "Book of Bonawitz and Bonawitz" wherein reference is made Anna Eva Walborn born 1720, who's parents were Christian Wilhelm Walborn and his wife Catherine Elizabeth nee Batdorf with the reference as being that of Reverend Christian Walborn indicates that this bit of information may supply some of missing data that was lost in the Moravian occupation of the early Tulpehocken Church.

Christian Wilhelm Walborn, who was active in the early church may well have supplied the early church as supply pastor though a lay-minister.

Herman Walborn, brother of the above, from records later in the Church corner-stone laid 1746; had been Warden of the early Tulpehocken Church.

(Note-Christian Emanuel Schulze, was the son-in-law of the Reverend Henry Melchoir Muhlenberg and Anna Maria nee Weiser. Reverend Christian Emanuel Schulz served as pastor of the Christ-Lutheran Church from Dec. 1770 to March 1809. A son John Andrew Schutz was born in the Church Parsonage 7/19/1775, brother of Christina Salome, resided in Myerstown, Pa. and served as the Governor of Pennsylvania from 1823 to 1829.)

(Anna Maria Weiser born June 24, 1727 and was baptised by the Reverend William Christoph Birkenmeyer, Lutheran Minister, with sponsors - Nicolas Feg and wife. Her parents were Conrad Weiser and wife, Anna Eva; who were married in 1720. Conrad Weiser, early Pioneer, Interpreter, Magistrate and Churchman had lived among the Mohawk Indians in the family of Quaynant, Mohawk Chief. Here he learned the language of the Magnaisch and became an Interpreter. Conrad Weiser Jr. was born Nov. 2, 1696 in the country of Wuerttemberg, in the Magistracy of Herrenberg at the village of Aestaet. He was the son of John Conrad Weiser Sr. and wife Anna Magdalena, nee Ueblen-she having died May 1, 1709 leaving ten children. J. Conrad Weiser Sr. as widower, brought a part of children along with the Palatines immigration to America in 1710. Two of his sons; Christoph Frederick and George were bound out to the Governor of Long Island while Conrad Jr. chose to live with the Mohawk Indians. The Senior Conrad Weiser became active in helping the Palatine

Families establish their settlement in the Tulpenhocken Valley in 1717. He later died at his son - Conrad Weiser's Home on July 13, 1760 at Womelsdorf, Pa. His father Jacob Weiser was a magistrate in the village of Astlach, in the District of Bachnang of the county of Wuerttemberg.

Anna Maria Weiser born June 24, 1727 was later married to the Reverend Henry Melchoir Muhlenberg, who had been born September 6, 1711 at Reimbeck, Hanover, Germany. He came to America in 1742 and located at Albany Township and died at Trappe October 7, 1787. They were the parents of the Reverend Henry E. Muhlenberg, who ministered to the Lutherans at Lancaster, Pennsylvania. Reverend Henry E. Muhlenberg was the father of a son - the Reverend Henry A. Muhlenberg, who became pastor of the Trinity Lutheran Church at Reading, Pa; where upon his retirement he was elected to Congress and later sent by the United States, as minister to Austria.

John Peter Muhlenberg, a second son of Anna Maria (Weiser) Muhlenberg also ordained as a Lutheran minister, was later ordained as a priest in the Protestant Episcopal Church for a pastorate in Virginia. In the midst of the Revolutionary Conflict in 1775, he joined the American Forces, as captain to fight for the American cause. His statue is among those in the Statuary Hall, at the national capitol, Washington, D. C.

Christop Frederick Weiser, who had been bounded out by his father, later located in New Jersey; where a son - Jacob Weiser was born September 22, 1736 and died at Tulpehocken, Pa. January 1, 1808. His wife - Anna Elizabeth Weiser born July 15, 1740; died October 1, 1805. Jacob and Anna Elizabeth Weiser were the parents of a son Jacob born 9/5/1774, who died 6/30/1793 at the age of 18 yrs. 9 mo. and 3 weeks. One daughter, Mary Weiser married George Illig. Another daughter of Jacob and Anna Elizabeth Weiser, born 12/23/1763 was married to John Peter Etschberger Sr. John Peter Etschberger had had a sister, Elizabeth who married George Buckley; two other sisters - Barbara and Magdalena; and a fourth sister, Catherine Etschberger wife of Peter Spycker Jr. Peter Spycker Senior and a brother Benjamine Spycker, were sons of one John Spycker.

John Peter Etchberger and wife Elizabeth nee Weiser born December 23, 1763 were the parents of seven children: Elizabeth, wife of Jacob Stuart; Maria, wife of John Tice; Catherine, wife of John Brown; Jacob and John - unmarried; George Etchberger, who married Catherine Minnich and Peter Etchberger Jr. born Nov. 4, 1794, who was married April 8, 1821 to Elizabeth Walborn born Feb. 4, 1802. The family resided near Myrestown, Pa. and were the parents of six children. Elizabeth Walborn was the daughter of Leonard Walborn born 2/7/1771 (1-2-8-6-) and the mother Rebecca Etchberger, who married Daniel Fegley; the parents of William Fegley who was a research worker for the Berks County Historica Society.

The first thirty-three Palatine Families, who had left their earlier location in Scholarie, N. Y. in early 1723 on their quest for permanent home-sites and guided by friendly Indians, finally reached their destination in the Wilds of what was then called Chester County, Pennsylvania. This locality, a previously recognized district, had obtained for itself the name "Tulpehocken", the "Land of the Turtle's Song."

Favorable reports carried back to other Palatinate Families in New York State encouraged additional families to come into this valley within the next few years. Yet it is difficult to realize the new dangers that these early pioneers were to face in this strange and mysterious region. Diseases, wild and dangerous animals, roving bands of a new and unfriendly type of nomadic people were some of the factors that plagued these early settlers. Their food must come from the wild-life and then too the earth must bring forth; so crops were to be planted for a substantial existence. Even the cultivated crops were often destroyed by wild-animals, swarms of insects and the elements of weather change.

Homes had to be carved out of this wilderness and the crude tools and implements of those early years impeded the progress of this tiny community. However, with an indomitable faith these rugged people continued to press onward. Fatal accidents in the felling of trees for the construction of dwellings only allowed a brief time for mourning-tribute. A sturdy people had come to this valley stay and create a new home-land. Each succeeding obstacle tested and strengthened a greater determination and a deeper faith as they pressed forward. They were helping to develop one of the greatest states of the Union. Their pride was later to be expressed in their Sworn Allegiance and Service to the new country.

Even though these Palatine Immigrants were devoutly religious, confined to the Lutheran and German Reformed Churches, they were not without differences in their convictions as often portrayed by a division in their church affiliations which resulted in the establishment of new denominations, such as the Moravian Body. However, many of these differences were more often only brief, and these early families were reunited in their associations. As the years wore on, these settlers showed to the new country that they wanted no alms, and those of their numbers who became indolent and public parasites were no longer worthy of their concern. Descendants of this band of immigrants later grew to be known as the "Pennsylvania Dutch". As their descendants spread outward from the Tulpehocken area and settled in new communities, they became associated with the Irish, the Scotsch and other nationalities with whom they intermarried. This new land had been the 'Melting Pot' for many seeking religious freedom, and freedom from oppression - not the freedom of selfish-expression and social-annihilation.

Turning to the Tulpehocken Settlement of 1723, and a map of this valley at that time, are seen the locations of land-ownership of many of these early settlers. Still others were engaged in other forms of livelihood and carried on serviceable trades.

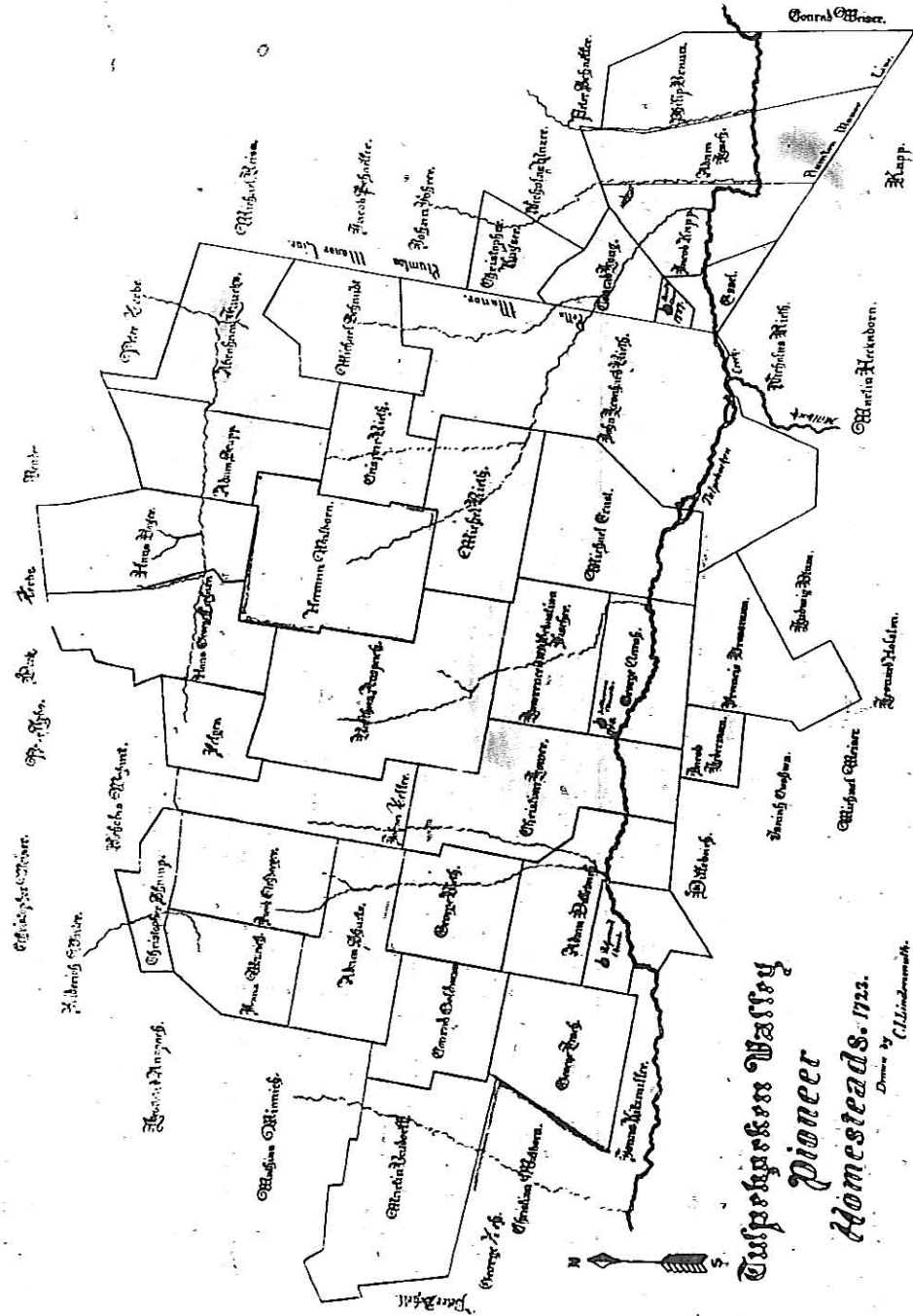
