May 7/66

I left Paris at six on Friday and had a slow and rather blowy passage to Southampton but was not sick or uncomfortable. We were late and I did not reach London till three h.m.

I found your letters at this office and went to Euston thinking your night arrive by Irish day mail. Your last was dated May 3^d. By a letter from J.S.P. this morning I find you are not to be in London before Wednesday.

Perhaps to day I may find a letter from you at Whitehall Club. ~~to day~~.

Yesterday I saw the Mr Taggarts and was at Talbot Square at tea and ~~at~~ supper. I have been these two nights at Mrs Burtons - St Albans Place - J.S.P.s lodging house, but shall be

elsewhere to night, or tomorrow at all
events. Where I don't yet know. My
old lodging house is quite full.
You can address to me here or White-
hall Club Parliament St. Here is
best address I think.

3 p.m. I have been running about
all day but have only had a glimpse
of J.F. Bob is in the country.

To night Arthur is to give me a
dinner and bed in the Temple.
