Sept. 3<sup>d</sup> 1866.

My dear Mamma

till ten. I did not much  
fancy Weston, but it is a  
breezy place and regular sea

Hotel in Bath till Saturday,  
so we shall see them. They  
then go on to stop with some  
one near Axbridge.

It is cold and blowy here  
and we have had a great
