## Publisher's Preface

The publisher wishes to acknowledge his gratitude to the Pennsylvania German Society for their kindness in extending permission to reprint this invaluable record of the early German immigrants to Pennsylvania. The lists therein, containing more than 38,000 names of persons who arrived in the port of Philadelphia between the years 1727 and 1808, form the basis of the ancestry of hundreds of thousands of Americans, enabling them to determine with certainty the time of their ancestors' arrivals in Pennsylvania and the place from whence they came.

The present printing in two volumes contains all the genealogical and historical data in the original three-volume edition published in 1934. Volume II of the original edition, consisting entirely of signatures in facsimile, was not considered of sufficient genealogical value to warrant the additional cost of reproduction and, hence, has been omitted from the present printing in order to make available a modestly priced reprint.

Except for this deliberate omission, the omission of other illustrations not of importance, and the reduction of the size of the margins to further lower the cost, our reprint is an exact reproduction of the original edition, which is listed as Number 146 in the recently revised and enlarged edition of Harold Lancour's BIBLIOGRAPHY OF SHIP PASSENGER LISTS, 1538-1825 (1963).

## INTRODUCTION

This volume contains the facsimiles of all the signs of the oath of allegiance (Lists B) as well as those to the abjuration (Lists C). The captains' lists (Lists A) were reproduced, with two exceptions, namely lists 229 A and 230 A. In these two cases no other lists were available, and seemed desirable to include at least one list of each ship's two captains' lists were inserted.

A brief explanation is herewith offered by the editor in the manner in which the lists were reproduced. There were two methods of reproduction available, either by half tone or line etchings. After some experimenting the latter method was chosen, as it seemed to offer several advantages. In the first place, it was possible by this method to remove most of the numerous inkspots, which deface so many of the lists. It enabled the editor to strengthen many thin, hardly distinguishable lines, which would not have appeared on the half tone reproduction. And lastly, in the case of many names, which could be reproduced with great difficulty, with the help of the magnifying glass the editor was able to trace these names and thus make them out from the mass of surrounding inkspots. The latter were then removed by Japanese white. But no names were removed until the whole list had been deciphered and gone over again. Many hours of tedious and painstaking work were thus spent in making the lists readable.

In this work, the editor had the hearty and efficient cooperation of the J. Horace McFarland Company, Inc., of Hagerstown, Pennsylvania. In some cases as many as three photographs were taken to present the lists in the best possible manner.

After the photographs had produced the best possible results, the editor went over them with minute strengthening lines or tracing names, until the result was satisfactory.

Then, the photographs were placed in the hands of N. J. Shea, of the Sun Engraving Company of Binghamton, New York.
