ELIGIBILITY CLAUSE

"Any woman is eligible for membership in the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution who is not less than eighteen years of age, and who is descended from a man or woman who, with unfailing loyalty to the cause of American Independence, served as a sailor, or as a soldier or civil officer in one of the several Colonies or States, or in the United Colonies or States, or as a recognized patriot, or rendered material aid thereto; provided the applicant is personally acceptable to the Society." (Constitution, Article III, Section 1.)

Marriage in every instance in this paper means legal and lawful marriage. Date of marriage may be substituted for dates of birth and death where such date proves the soldier to have been living during the Revolution and of a suitable age for service. (Note: Resolution adopted by the twenty-fourth Continental Congress: Descendants of polygamous marriage can not be accepted as members of this Society.)

ANCESTOR'S SERVICES

The said Joseph Doll (spellings: Dolle, Dohld, Dold) ^{other} who resided during the American Revolution at Frederick Co., Maryland assisted in establishing American Independence, while acting in the capacity of Patriot, Service to his country.

My ancestors's services during the Revolutionary War were as follows:

The D.A.R. Maryland State Society Directory of Members and Ancestors 1892-1965 gives the following information on page 275: "Doll (Dolle), Joseph. ...; Patriot; Member of Committee of Observation; signed Oath of Fidelity and Support Frederick Co., Md."

Joseph Doll owner of a general store in Frederick, Md. During the Revolutionary War, not only declared for the Patriotic Cause, but was active in the war effort even though not a Continental soldiers. Experienced in securing supplies, Joseph was delegated to assemble the materials needed for a new jail to house the Tories from the area. He also secured blankets and articles of clothing for the soldiers, and served in Captian John Haass's Company in what we would call the Home guard with the rank of Sergeant. This is found in Vol. 11 of the "Maryland Historical Magazine" which also states that "on October 24, 1776 the Committee ordered Captain Hanson to pay Captain Doll his account for money spent".

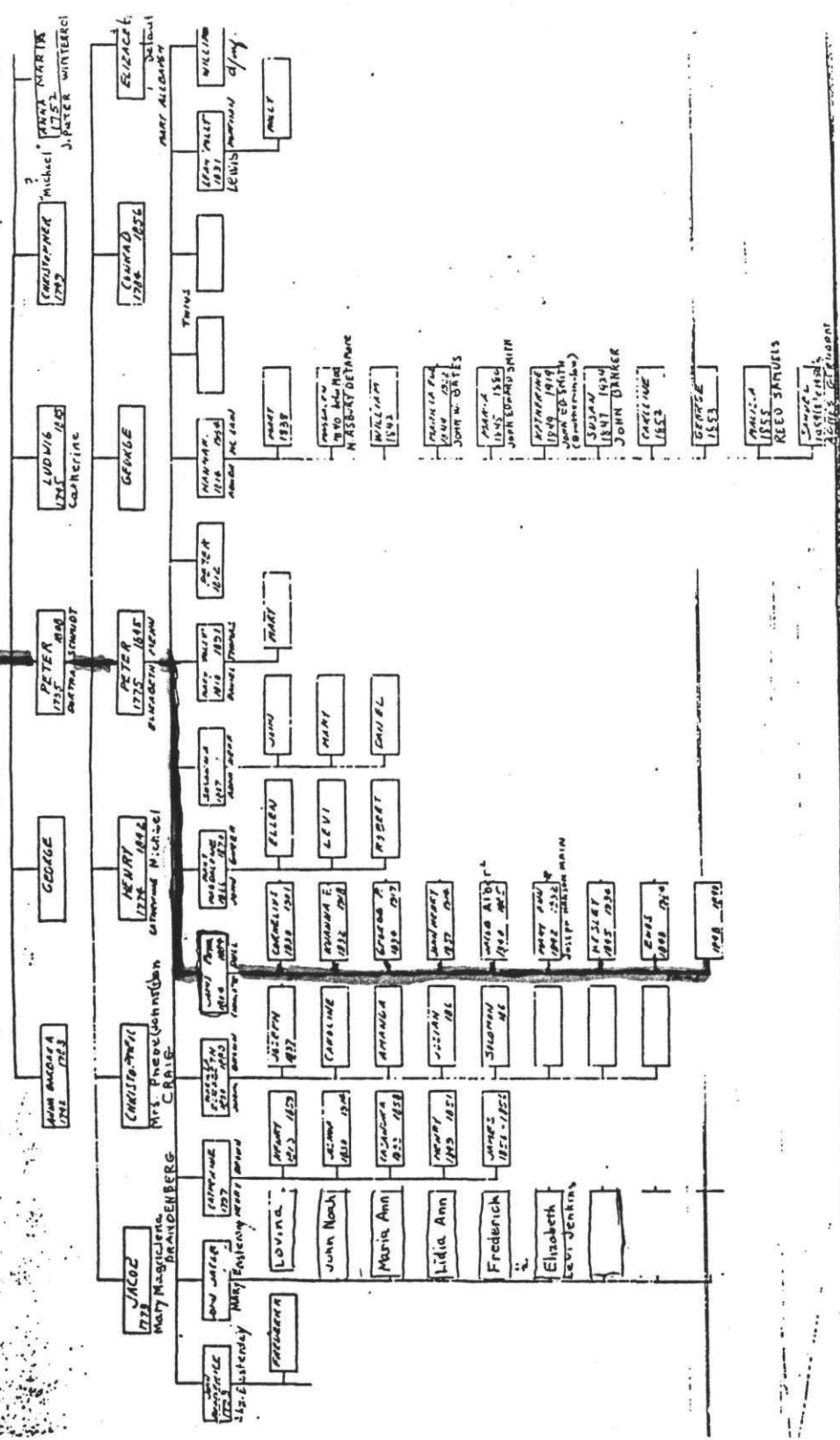

tion from taxes for thirty years. After some time the elector, who seems to have believed that promises made to heretics should not be observed, began to persecute his Protestant subjects. The French army having again crossed the Rhine, the distressed Palatines, persecuted by their prince and plundered by a foreign enemy, fled to England, about six thousand of them, for protection, in consequence of encouragement they had received from Queen Anne, by proclamation, 1708.

Having pitched their tents at a small distance from London, they were supported at public expense, until they could be shipped off for Ireland or the colonies. *Christopher de Graffenried* and *Lewis Michell* were attempting about this time, to mend their fortunes by purchasing lands in some of the British colonies. Michell had been several years in America,* and had obtained some knowledge of the country.

✓ NOTE.—Michell was originally employed by the Canton of Bern in Switzerland, to search for a large tract of vacant land on the frontiers of Pennsylvania, Virginia or Carolina, to which they might send a colony. He spent some years in exploring the country. There was no scarcity of mountainous land, such as those people are accustomed to; but they desisted from the project.

The lords proprietors of Carolina had agreed with those gentlemen, April, 1706, that ten thousand acres of land should be laid off for them in one body, between *Neuse* and *Cape Fear*, they paying twenty shillings for every hundred acres, and sixpence the yearly quit-rent. The Surveyor General was also instructed to lay off an additional tract of one hundred thousand acres, which was to be reserved twelve years. One of them was to be gratified by a title, when he should pay the usual price for five thousand acres of land. *De Graffenried* made the purchase and was created a baron. This company, having secured the lands, wished to make them productive by settling them with tenants; and the poor Palatines presented themselves as an object of speculation. Commissioners had been appointed by the Queen to collect and receive money for the use of the Palatines, and to provide them with settlements. *Graffenried* and *Michell* covenanted with those commissioners, that they would transport to North Carolina six hundred and fifty of the Palatines (about one hundred families); that they would lay off for

Dear Mrs. Shaver:

I have finally gotten around to assembling what I have available of the Doll family history in which you might be interested. I have included nothing on my mother's side as these people were all from Southern Maryland and never got farther away than Baltimore. You will notice that some of the sheets have numbers in ink on the lower right hand corner. I had planned to someday index the material, which I never completed, and I numbered the sheets for my own convenience. They are the last I have and you are welcome to them without any expense to you. You are very kind to offer to pay for them but I am only too happy to have you put them to whatever good use you can. So I am clipping your check to them and I hope you will find it when you remove the sheets.

Now I have a suggestion. Many of these sheets are lightly printed and will not copy on the ordinary Public Library copy machines. If you want to share these sheets with other people and libraries and Historical Societies you should find a copy machine such as the ones advertised as being able to copy light print in to dark print. They are available in commercial establishments. So run off as many sets as you want or need as these are the last I have outside my own file. These are punched for a three ring hard cover binder.

Much of the material I am enclosing may not be of direct interest to you but it will give you the background of the names of the original German settlers in Frederick, Maryland. These intermarried and spread out from Maryland and today many of these people have no knowledge of their ancestry. Perhaps thru your efforts some of them may come across names in their German heritage that will excite their interest in their own genealogy. I had an interesting experience in this regard. A woman in St. Louis contacted me because she is a descendant of the Jacob Doll who was born in Bretten in 1741 and as an adult married Margaret --- in Frederick. I have noted on page Doll 6 that of their 8 children ~~that~~ two were born in Frederick and six in Hampshire County, Va. This woman and I spent a lot of time tracing these eight children and we ran across a great deal of history as it applied to their wanderings in the westward migration of the times. It is not included in my material but if you ever come across any descendants of this Jacob I have helpful material for their family research. Incidentally if you copy any of the sheets with the inked numbers on them you can clip the numbers off before copying or cover them with white tape. This will eliminate confusion with the numbers at the top of each page.

Please let me know if you have questions about our Dolls.

This is the story of some of the ancestors of Charles Edward Doll and James Randolph Doll, brothers. Both boys were born in Baltimore, Maryland, sons of Charles Edward Doll and Virginia Taylor Hamilton Doll. Both parents were born in Baltimore.

On the Doll side we find the names Hartmann, Haller, Peters, Stuart, Myers, Adams, Daniels, and Taylor.

On the Hamilton side we find the names Watkins, Besson, Gassaway, Taylor, Tatlow, Godman, Brown, Orem, Alchorne, and Lankford.

Past generations on both sides of the family were largely untouched by Webster's admonition. As a result, assembling this information has been difficult, and parts of it are incomplete. A few pictures have been found and are included, as well as family lists with names and dates.

This is the story of the descendants of Baptista Dohd, free and townsman of 17th century Breiten in now Baden, West Germany. It is really two stories, the one how the records were uncovered, the second the records themselves. From the time of the birth of Baptista's son Johannes on January 17, 1700 down to the year 1972 in which this is written, the record spans nearly 300 years of important history. One can only surmise the tremendous efforts our forbears had to make to feed and clothe their families, their hardships, their sacrifices for each other, and the numbers of unmarked graves that received each one in his or her appointed time. History records the trials of these emigrants from both banks of the Rhine as they set out for America. Agents of William Penn, and others, had traveled among them extolling the wonders of a new life beyond the sea. Each had to sell everything he owned to raise passage money. They were forced to pay a transit tax to each principality through which they passed, and when they got to Rotterdam they were beset by unscrupulous knaves and sea captains through whom they had to arrange for food and transportation for the perilous months which lay ahead. Many never lived to see the end of their voyage, but the love for each other, of those that did survive, must in some unknown way have given new strength to heart and mind to succeed. Such is our heritage, and because of it, we are each possessed with a built-in compass which points the way we should take. To follow any other course is to break faith with those who have made us what we are.

* * * *

The two stories referred to here-to-fore are interwoven in the telling. Lists are included to make names and dates come alive, where otherwise they might seem monotonous statistics.

Young people, by and large, seldom take a very abiding interest in their ancestors. But as I grew older, I asked my father what he knew about his people. His own father had died when he was a baby, and his mother died when he was 22 years of age. In August 1907 our young family moved from Baltimore, so we lost track of most of our Doll relatives as we moved successfully to Kittanning, Pennsylvania; East Palestine, Ohio; and Mount Clemens, Michigan.

In a humorous mood, father's stock answers about his ancestors were that they were either Pennsylvania Dutch, or were descendants of Hessians captured at Trenton. I wish I had started this search sooner, but it was

not until after his death in June 1966, and my permanent retirement from business, that I found time to begin this project. By that time, father's people were all gone except his sister Olive Irene who lives in Baltimore. Through her I found out that my father's parents, and his father's parents are buried in Loudon Park Cemetery in Baltimore. A visit to their graves gave me the names and dates. Aunt Irene also told me that my newly discovered great grandfather, Daniel Doll, had come from Frederick, Maryland to work in the shops of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad in Baltimore.

At this point I was faced with securing the help of someone who knew how to find old local records, and how to make use of them. The Maryland Historical Society sent me a list of Registered Professional Genealogists, which included the name of Miss Margaret E. Myers, 317 East Third Street, Frederick, Maryland. Now knowing that great grandfather Daniel Doll had come from Frederick, I contacted Miss Myers and asked her if she thought any records concerning Dolls might be available in Frederick. She agreed to see what she could find. Her knowledge of the community led her to think the Dolls might have been members of the Evangelical and Reformed Church in Frederick. So she started with their records.

To make a long story shorter, Miss Myers placed the key blocks in the arch of the history of the Doll family in Frederick. The earliest record she found was of the marriage of Joseph Doll to Charlotte --- in 1767. Other entries followed proving without doubt that Joseph was the grandfather of our known ancestor Daniel Doll, born in Frederick in 1816, the same Daniel who was buried in Loudon Park, Baltimore in 1881. She found many names and dates of births and marriages for several generations. She furnished copies of early Doll wills on file in the Court House, and also many references to the part the men of the family took in the commercial and political life of Frederick. The writer wishes to acknowledge his indebtedness to Miss Myers for her kindness, cheerful assistance, and valuable help, without which this story might never have come into being.

My next problem was to learn who were the parents of Joseph Doll and where he was born. Knowing that many early Germans had lived in York County, Pennsylvania, I solicited the help of the York County Historical Society. Their search of all available York County records turned up nothing.

My search then moved to Lancaster, Pennsylvania. An inquiry to the First Reformed Church in Lancaster brought a response from Miss Anna Mary Charles, the church secretary, stating that their records for 1747 included the birth and baptismal dates for a Joseph Doll, son of John and Catherine Hartmann Doll of Bretten, Germany, witnesses Conrad Doll and wife. This date, 1747, is the same as that given in the D.A.R. records for Joseph Doll, Patriot, of Frederick Maryland. Miss Charles could find

no other children for this family, and suggested inquiring at Trinity Lutheran Church in Lancaster. We are indebted to Miss Charles for her kindness in locating this important information.

The inquiry to Trinity Lutheran Church was referred to Mr. George W. Leonard of 8 Lepore Drive, Lancaster who looked up old church records and other published materials concerning Dolls who emigrated to Pennsylvania from Germany. We are indebted to Mr. Leonard for his kind assistance.

Intrigued with the challenge of discovering more about John and Catharine Doll of Bretten, Germany, I addressed a letter to the Pastor of the Evangelical church in Bretten. This inquiry was referred to Mr. Willy Bickel, 7518 Bretten/Baden, Postweg 47, West Germany. With a great deal of patience, Mr. Bickel went through the old and dim records of the church prior to 1747. He was able to find the records of the parents of John and Catharine. He also found the names and birth dates of John and Catharine and their seven children together with the information that the family left Bretten for America in 1741. What an exciting and unexpected discovery! We are very grateful to Mr. Bickel for his kindness and persistence in searching those time-worn, hard-to-read records. Without his help, this record would be neither as complete nor as interesting.

* * * *

The ancestors of Baptista Dohld were undoubtedly long time residents of the section of Europe where this story takes its beginning. The area along the Rhine river had been fought over repeatedly in both religious wars, and wars between the petty princes who vied for the allegiance and servitude of the wretched inhabitants. Entire villages were slaughtered at regular intervals, and their farms, livestock, and buildings looted. It is no wonder that these people were fertile prospects to start a new life in a wild and distant land. They really had nothing to lose, and everything to gain, in deciding on a new adventure. The emigrants were mostly those with growing families who were vigorous and strong enough to survive, although the leaders of the early expeditions were mature men whom others would follow. Some of these older men went back and forth across the ocean several times to promote the flow of friends and neighbors to the new world.

Baptista Dohld was born in the latter half of the 17th century. We have no record of his parents, nor of any brothers and sisters. He is listed as "free-and townsman of Bretten", and worked as a "carrier and driver". This probably meant he was a teamster, driving freight and delivery wagons. His wife was Anna Catharina, but "her girls name is not yet known."

Johannes Dohld (Doll) was born to Baptista and his wife Anna Catharina on January 17, 1700. We have no record of brothers and sisters, although they might be found in the church lists in Bretten.

Also living in Bretten was Johann (Hans) Leonhard Hartmann and his wife Margaretha. Johann Hartmann "was free-and townsman of Bretten and worked as a shoemaker. He was relieving-officer and church-warden too. His day of death was 6th May 1754". Margaretha's "girls name is not yet known".

Catharina Hartmann was born in Bretten on the 5th of August, 1704 to Johann and Margaretha. We have no record of brothers or sisters.

"Johannes Doll, the young, preserved at the 1st of March 1728 his civil rights. At the 18th of May 1728 he had his wedding with Catharina Hartmann."

Johannes and Catharina Doll had seven children before they left for America. The Bretten church records show -

Mr. Bickel found that Johannes Doll emigrated to America in 1741. In the book "Pennsylvania German Pioneers" published by the Pennsylvania German Society there is recorded the arrival of Johannes Doll and "Palatines" on September 23, 1741 on the ship Marlborough, Thomas Bell, Master. So the Dolls came to the New World along with many of their countrymen.

Our ancestors may have lived with relatives or friends in any of the small settlements into which these strangers in a strange land huddled for protection and security when they first arrived. How many survived the journey we do not know for sure. There is no further record of Johann Jacob Doll or Johann Martin Doll. **Both had died in 1733.**

The first authentic record concerning John (Johannes) and Catharine (Catharina) Doll is found in the First Reformed Church of Lancaster, Pennsylvania as mentioned on page 2. Their baptismal records contain the entry:

"Joseph, son of John Doll of Bretten, Palatine, and Catharine, daughter of Leonard Hartman of Bretten, was baptised on May 13, 1747, by the Reverend Michael Schlatter, pastor of the Philadelphia and Germantown Churches. The date of birth is recorded as January 27, 1747, and the sponsors were Conrad Doll and wife."

How long the Dolls lived in the little community of Lancaster we do not know. Nor have we discovered a record of any other children born to John and Catharine between the time they arrived in America in 1741, and the birth of Joseph in 1747. We do have some reason to believe that a child named George was born before Joseph.

I have found no record of the occupation John (Johannes) followed to support his family. The Lancaster church record gives the date of his death as February 3, 1765. His wife Catharine (Catharina) died November 7, 1785.

The spirit of the times dictated the destinies of the children of John and Catharine. We know three of the brothers left Lancaster to seek their fortunes. The First Reformed Church records some of the events concerning the family. Although Joseph is our ancestor, it seems of interest to record the little we know of the others.

Anna Margaretha Doll of Jno. married John George Burkhart on October 28, 1753. The record supplied by Mr. Leonard shows they had 6 children:

Sometimes the name Burkhart is spelled Burkhard. The church record states that Anna Margaretha Doll Burkhart was buried October 23, 1812.

Catharina Doll was married in the First Reformed Church on April 23, 1758 to John Huff. We know of only 3 children:

Harry Lee Doll, Episcopal Bishop of Maryland, and Rebecca Tidball Doll, P.O. Box 272, Alexandria, Va. are descendants of Johannes (1736) through his son George (1769). Rebecca Doll has their family tree.

The First Reformed Church records the marriage of a George Doll to Elizabeth Mildeberger on August 11, 1767. This may be the George we believe was born after the Dolls arrived in America.

Conrad Doll, was the oldest of the three brothers that turned up in Frederick, Maryland. Brumbaugh's "Maryland Records", Vol. 2, page 508 records the marriage of Conrad Doll to Anna Maria Schisler on September 20, 1761. The place is not given, but their first child, Anna Maria, was baptized in the Evangelical and Reformed Church in Frederick on August 1, 1762. There are 5 additional children recorded:

Conrad became a cabinet maker. The Frederick Herald of November 5, 1814 gives the following obituary: "Doll, Conrad 1739-1814 died Mon. 31st October, 1814 in the 76th year of his age. Conrad Doll was a good citizen, and a worthy man." His will is on file in the Court House in Frederick.

Jacob Doll married Margaret --. We do not know where or when, but their first child, John, was baptized June 7, 1767 in the Evangelical and Reformed Church in Frederick. There are 4 additional children recorded:

Jacob moved to Hampshire County, Va. He is listed there in the 1810 U.S. Census. His brother Conrad had purchased land in Hampshire County in 1787 from Peter Noll, and this may have been a reason for Jacob to leave Frederick. A Jacob Doll, who was a blacksmith by trade, died in Hampshire County May 9, 1836, leaving 9 children. Our Frederick, Maryland Jacob had no children baptized in Frederick after Magdallen on April 30, 1786. But the Jacob who died in 1836 may have been a son born in Hampshire County after the first Jacob moved there from Frederick. There are Dolls living today in the Laureldale and Antioch sections of West Virginia. This area is out from Keyser, which is on U.S. 50. We have discovered three additional children for Jacob and Margaret. All were born in Hampshire County, Va. They are Jacob b. 1771, Margaret b. 1774, and Daniel b. ca 1790. John and Magdallen were born in Frederick but Susanna, Abraham and Anna Maria were also born in Hampshire County. The Jacob listed above as dying in 1836 is the one b. 1771. Jacob married Catherine McNemar June 30, 1799. They had 9 children.

Joseph, the youngest of the children of John and Catharine is not heard of from the time he was baptized in 1747 until his marriage to Charlotte -- in September of 1767 in the Evangelical and Reformed Church in Frederick. We assume he followed his older brothers, Conrad and Jacob, to Frederick. While there he may have lived in the home of one of his married brothers. In trying to find the maiden name of Charlotte I started with the year 1751, the date given in her obituary in the "Frederick Herald." I examined all the birth and baptismal records of the Evangelical and Reformed Church for that year. Possibly Charlotte was born somewhere else, but the only girl baby recorded in 1751 was the daughter of Jacob and Maria Benduta Storm christened Charlotte on August 11, 1751. There is no direct evidence to confirm or deny that she became the wife of Joseph.

Joseph and Charlotte had 14 children, all recorded in the Evangelical and Reformed Church. They are:

By 1771 Joseph had opened a general store. His ledger for the store is in possession of the Frederick County Historical Society. It gives the names of the early families of the town who traded with him. During the Revolutionary War Joseph not only declared for the Patriotic Cause, but was active in the war effort even though not a Continental soldier. Experienced in securing supplies, Joseph was delegated to assemble the materials needed for a new jail to house the Tories from the area. He also secured blankets and articles of clothing for the soldiers, and served in Captain John Haass's Company in what we would call the Home Guard with the rank of Sergeant. This is found in Vol. 11 of the "Maryland Historical Magazine", which also states that "on October 24, 1776 the Committee ordered Captain Hanson to pay Captain Doll his account for money spent".

Joseph Doll and his brother Conrad were active members of the Evangelical and Reformed Church. In "First Settlements of Germans in Maryland" by Edward T. Schultz, it is stated on page 9 that the membership of the church "came from the Pennsylvania settlements as well as direct from the fatherland", and includes the name Doll.

As with present day church congregations, things did not always move smoothly. For example, in "Maryland Historical Magazine" Vol. 10, page 59 the following notice is quoted from Bartgis' Maryland Gazette for January 2, 9, and 16, 1794: "Notice is hereby given by the Vestry of the High Dutch Reformed Congregation, in Frederick Town; a rumour being spread, that evil-minded persons intended to use a violence on the property of said Congregation. As the said Vestry, being regularly elected, installed and served as such, a number of years: being, therefore, authorized and constrained by the deeds on said Congregation's property, as likewise the long established rules of said Congregation, by said Congregation adopted and underwritten. Being desirous to preserve, love and peace, exhort all who may have been led astray, to consider, we dare not violate our trust-are therefore, under a necessity to notify that, if violence is used, we must seek protection, under God, by the laws of our country. Signed, John Brunner of Henry, Joseph Doll, John Brunner, John Gebhart, Jacob Rohr, Jacob Metzger, Henry Baer, Jacob Brunner."

In Dieter Cunz' book "The Maryland Germans" page 188 the following appears: "the Constitution of the Reformed Church of Frederick was drawn up in 1803 under the Reverend Daniel Wagner (from Dutchy of Nassau, Germany, 1750). Signed by the most important members of the Congregation." The signers included Joseph Doll and Conrad Doll.

The obituary for Charlotte Doll was published in the Frederick Herald for June 5, 1824, it reads as follows: "Doll, Charlotte 1751-1824 died yesterday in the 74th year of her age. Mrs. Charlotte Doll was the consort of the late Joseph Doll of this city."

Joseph Doll died August 3, 1819. The D.A.R. Maryland State Society Directory of Members and Ancestors 1892-1965 gives the following information on page 275: "Doll (Dulle), Joseph b. 1747-8; d. 3 Aug. 1819 Md.; m. Sept. 1767 Charlotte d. 3 Feb. 1832; Patriot; Member of Committee of Observation; signed Oath of Fidelity and Support Frederick Co., Md." The National Headquarters of the D.A.R. could give me no record for the source of their information. It must not have been thoroughly documented or they would have had an exact year for the birth of Joseph, nor would they have given the year of Charlotte's death as 1832, when her obituary appeared in the Frederick Herald for June 5, 1824.

As the flow of German families increased, many settled in the southern Pennsylvania counties of York and Adams. Others continued south into Frederick County, Maryland. The town of Frederick was originally established by the English, Scotch, and Irish. When the influx of Germans took place, they were looked upon with some disdain by the earlier settlers. The German girls became house servants, and the men performed the heavier and more lowly tasks in the community. This resulted in the newcomers keeping to themselves and holding to their old world traditions. This was particularly true of their social customs,

their manner of celebrating the holidays such as Christmas, and in clinging to their Old World religions. As a result Germans largely married Germans.

Our ancestor Jacob, the 13th child of Joseph and Charlotte Doll, was born August 21, 1791, and baptized October 9, 1791. I have never found how much education he received or what trade he followed. Jacob did, however, do one thing different than most of his brothers and sisters and cousins. He married a girl with an Anglicized name. The spelling would indicate that she was English, but so far I have no history of her. Jacob Doll and Mary Myers were married on May 30, 1812. The record by Miss Margaret E. Myers (no relation) reporting this event indicates they may have been married in the German Church. This is not certain, although their children were baptized in the Evangelical and Reformed Church where Mary is spelled Maria in the records. Their children were:

Jacob Doll died May 13, 1841. We know nothing further concerning Mary Myers Doll.

Daniel, the oldest child of Jacob and Mary Myers Doll is our next ancestor. He was born February 9, 1816. Daniel Doll and Mary Catharine Peters, daughter of Charles and Mary Stuart Peters, were married November 25, 1841 by the Reverend A.A. Reese. Mary Catharine was born February 12, 1820. Daniel became a railroad man, moving to Baltimore where he worked for the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad. On a separate page is told what is known of the family of Mary Catharine Peters Doll. At least two of their children were born in Frederick and the others probably in Baltimore. Their children were:

Daniel Doll died in Baltimore July 3, 1881 and his wife, Mary Catharine Peters Doll, died on September 2, 1891. They are buried in Loudon Park Cemetery, Baltimore.

Charles Edward Doll, the 6th child of Daniel and Mary Catharine Peters Doll, was born August 14, 1851. Young Charles, while working for the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad, became acquainted with Anna Mary Taylor of Cumberland, Maryland. (The ancestry of Anna Mary Taylor is found in more detail under both Taylor and Daniels). Anna Mary, the daughter of David Taylor and Margaret Daniels Taylor, was born on October 22, 1853 in Cumberland. Her mother Margaret died May 2, 1862, and her father later married Olive Brooks. David Taylor died January 15, 1871. Olive Brooks Taylor raised Anna Mary and her sisters and brother. Charles Edward Doll and Anna Mary Taylor were married in Cumberland on October 17, 1872.

The first child was born in Martinsburg, West Virginia where the couple had moved on assignment by the Railroad. Returning to Cumberland three more daughters were born. Moving again, this time to Baltimore where Charles Edward continued to work, along with his father, for the B.&O. Railroad, their son was born. Their children are:

Charles Edward Doll died of Bright's disease on August 6, 1885 just before his 34th birthday, leaving Anna Mary with the responsibility of raising and educating 5 children. She was employed at some time during this period at Birds Dry Goods Store. She was also quite a fine milliner, and ladies came to the house to select frames and materials for their hats. After living at several addresses in West Baltimore, the family moved to 1518 W. Fayette Street.

The girls were educated in the public schools and at the Samuel Ready School for Girls. Charles Edward attended public schools through the 10th grade.

Cora married John Mitchell when she was 16 years of age. They had 2 children, Ellen Augusta Mitchell and Charles Doll Mitchell. On September 3, 1902 Cora married William Murray Correll. They had 3 children, William Murray Correll, Jr., Dorothy Doll Correll, and Jane Lawrenson Correll.

Blanche attended Maryland State Normal College. She returned to Samuel Ready School where she taught until shortly before her death on December 31, 1910.

Helen attended Latin School, and graduated from Goucher College. She taught school in Baltimore before marrying John Walter Tottle on July 15, 1903. They had 5 children, John Walter Tottle, Jr., Helen Hawthorne Tottle, Anna Doll Tottle, Florence Colbert Tottle, and Elizabeth Brooks Tottle.

Olive Irene graduated as a Registered Nurse having trained at Union Memorial Hospital.

Charles Edward attended Baltimore City College until the 10th grade. On May 27, 1903 he was married to Virginia Taylor Hamilton. They had 2 sons, Charles Edward Doll III and James Randolph Doll.

WOMEN IN OUR DOLL ANCESTRY

16 ? - 17 ?

The earliest female ancestor of record is Anna Catharina, native of the village of Bretten in Baden, Germany. She was the wife of Baptista Dohld, and the mother of Johannes who was the first of the family to emigrate to America. Her maiden name is unknown, and we do not know when she was born, when she married Baptista and when she died. A study of the Evangelical Church records in Bretten might reveal some of this information.

1704 - 1785

Catharina Hartmann was born in Bretten, Germany August 5, 1704. Her parents were Johann (Hans) Leonhard Hartmann and his wife Margaretha. Catharina Hartmann and Johannes Dohld were married May 18, 1728. Arriving in America, the name was somehow changed from Dohld to Doll. Catharina died November 7, 1785 in Lancaster, Pennsylvania.

1751 - 1824

Charlotte ~~STURM~~ was born in 1751. We know her only as Charlotte as we have no record of her maiden name. In September of 1767, she married Joseph, the son of Johannes and Catharina Hartmann Doll. They had 14 children. Perhaps some of their descendants may know her maiden name. Charlotte died in Frederick, Maryland June 4, 1824.

17 ? - 18 ?

Mary ~~Myers~~ married Jacob, the 13th child of Joseph and Charlotte Doll on May 30, 1812. Efforts are being made to get more information on Mary Myers, date of birth, parents, etc.

1820 - 1891

Mary Catharine Peters, the wife of Daniel Doll, was born January 12, 1820. She was the daughter of Charles M. and Mary Stuart Peters. Her paternal grandparents were Charles Peters and Catharine Haller Peters. Charles Peters came to Annapolis, Maryland from Scotland. Catharine Haller, born May 4, 1763, came to Annapolis from Holland. They were married there, date unknown. After the death of Charles (date unknown) Catharine Haller Peters moved to Frederick, Maryland. She died there January 13, 1847. Their son, Charles M. Peters, born March 13, 1794 is the father of Mary Catharine Peters. He died October 2, 1834.

The maternal grandparents of Mary Catharine Peters were John and Mary Stuart. They came to Annapolis from Scotland about 1785. They brought with them some little silver spoons showing the monogram J M S. These spoons are now in the possession of Anna Doll Tottle Ball of Baltimore (1972). The Stuarts settled at Annapolis. Their son William was born there November 30, 1792; he died in November 1846. Their daughter Mary was born October 12, 1794. The Stuart family moved to a small settlement between Westminster and Frederick, Maryland called Lingamore Mills, so named because a grist mill had been built on Lingamore Creek. John became the miller.

While living here Mary Stuart died. John Stuart married again. One winter morning he mounted his horse to go to Frederick. The riderless horse returned and was found standing at the gate. It was assumed horse and rider broke through the ice while crossing the Monocacy river. The next spring his body was found in the Potomac river near Georgetown. Dates unknown.

Mary, the daughter of John and Mary, married Charles M. Peters on April 7, 1816. They had 6 children:

Charles M. Peters died October 2, 1834. Mary Stuart Peters died October 23, 1843.

The source of the names and dates in the above information is the Peters family Bible now in possession of Jane Correll Reid (Mrs. G.V.) 906 W. 30th St., Richmond, Va. Also in this Bible is a sampler embroidered by Mary Catharine. The top has the letters of the alphabet, and the bottom half has the following embroidered in this manner:

Another source of the information is a letter by William Neff Doll dated September 10, 1932. Note: in this letter he gives the Scotch spelling for STUART, while in the Peters Bible the name is spelled STEWART. For clarity, STUART is used throughout as it is believed to be the correct spelling.

Mary Catharine Peters and Daniel Doll, son of Jacob and Mary ~~Myers~~ ^{Meyer} Doll, were married November 25, 1841. Their first child was named Charles for her father and grandfather. This child died in infancy, so their 6th child was also named Charles. This name has continued for two more generations. Mary Catharine Peters Doll died at her home at 517 S. Paca St., Baltimore on Sept. 2, 1891. She is buried in Loudon Park Cemetery.

WOMEN IN OUR DOLL ANCESTRY 3

1853 - 1905

Anna Mary Taylor, the second child of David Taylor and Margaret Daniels Taylor, was born on October 22, 1853 in Cumberland, Maryland. On October 17, 1872 Anna Mary and Charles Edward Doll were married in Cumberland. Charles Edward was the 6th child of Daniel and Mary Catharine Peters Doll. She died August 5, 1905 in Baltimore, and is buried in Loudon Park Cemetery. Her ancestry is told in more detail in the sections concerning the Taylor and Daniels families.

1882 - 1958

Virginia Taylor Hamilton, the 3rd child of Columbus James and Sarah Rebecca Taylor Hamilton, was born August 18, 1882 in Baltimore, Maryland. The wedding of Virginia and Charles Edward Doll II took place in St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Baltimore on May 27, 1903. Charles Edward II was the 5th child and only son of Charles Edward and Anna Mary Taylor Doll. Virginia died in Mount Clemens, Michigan on April 10, 1958, and is buried in the mausoleum in Clinton Grove Cemetery. There are many more details of her ancestry in the sections concerning the Watkins, Taylor, and Hamilton families.

THE ANCESTRY OF CHARLOTTE STORM (STURM) WHO MARRIED JOSEPH DOLL
IN THE EVANGELICAL AND REFORMED CHURCH IN FREDERICK, MARYLAND
IN SEPTEMBER 1767.

When Charlotte Doll died June 5, 1824 the Frederick Herald stated she was in her 74th year. Thus she was born in 1751. The only girl baby christened Charlotte in the Evangelical and Reformed Church records in Frederick in 1751 was Charlotte daughter of Johann Jacob Sturm and his wife Anna Benedictina whose maiden name was Saur. This took place August 11. The parents of Johann Jacob Sturm were Christian Sturm and his second wife Anna Barbara Gah. They were married May 10, 1695. This record and several more early names and dates are found in the Iggelheim-Schifferstadt church books now in the Palatinate Protestant Church archives in Speyer, West Germany. Johann Jacob Sturm, their son was born February 13, 1701. It might be remembered here that Johannes Dohld whose son Joseph was to marry Johann Jacob Sturm's daughter Charlotte was born in Bretten, Germany January 17, 1700.

There is no known date for the marriage of Johann Jacob Sturm to Anna Benedictina Saur nor do we have the ancestry of Anna Saur. However, their first child was born April 21, 1726 and a second child was born November 27, 1727.

In 1728 Johann Jacob Sturm came to America with his wife and children together with his neighbor Johann Jacob Brunner and his family. The Brunners had lived in Schifferstadt, Pfalz, Germany about fifty years at the time but the Sturms had been there according to local records since about 1470. Jacob Sturm was 27 years old and Jacob Brunner was 25. They arrived in Philadelphia August 23, 1728. The next year Jacob Brunner's parents came over bringing all their children, a son-in-law and two grandchildren. William Hinke, the Historian, says the Sturms were in Lancaster, Pennsylvania in 1739 and 1741 because one of their children was baptized in the Evangelical and Reformed Church there in each of those years. These same children are named in their father's will probated in Frederick County, Maryland in 1756. We can assume that Jacob Brunner was in Lancaster at the same time since his wife was Jacob Sturm's sister Barbara. We know that Stephen Rensburg or Ramsberg lived there at one time also. His wife was Jacob Brunner's sister. By 1744 these families are listed on the Maryland Rent Rolls as residing on "Tasker's Chance", a 7,000 acre tract that was officially opened to German settlers July 28, 1746 in what was to become Frederick County, Maryland. Were the Sturms, Brunners and Ramsburgs living in Lancaster when Johannes Dohld and his family arrived in 1741? Did they befriend and shelter the Dohlds? Was this association the link that caused three sons of Johannes Dohld to go to Frederick, Maryland when they became of age? Was this relationship why Joseph Doll sought a wife from the next to the youngest child of Jacob and Anna Sturm? Jacob Sturm died in 1756 and his widow remarried the next year. She had no more children but she made a home for her five youngest until they went out on their own. Charlotte was the next youngest.

2.

The name Sturm was changed to Storm on most of the Frederick County records. The executors of the will of Jacob Storm did not carry out his instructions to sell his land and distribute the proceeds to his wife and children until June 3, 1765. At that time they drew up a list of heirs. Since Charlotte was unmarried then she was put down on the list as Charlotte Storm. When her inheritance was actually conveyed to her is unclear since for some unknown reason the 1765 sale of her father's land was not reported to the Frederick County Court until October 15, 1784. The report to the Court must have been made up from the 1765 list of heirs who certainly must have received their portions years before because Charlotte Doll was still listed as Charlotte Storm. Who received or held Charlotte's share we do not know. She was not quite 14 years old in June 1765. It is possible that as soon as she was 16 she received her inheritance and promptly married Joseph Doll. It may even have been this money that enabled Joseph to open a general store in Frederick in 1772.

Faith, logic, intuition, and much more are necessary for genealogical research. Although Joseph and Charlotte had thirteen children that lived to maturity there is no record in Frederick today that actually gives the maiden name of Charlotte Doll. Logic requires that Joseph married a German girl. These early pioneers were clannish. The total population was small in the immediate area and if there had been a former friendship between the Dohlds and the Sturms it is possible that this finally led to the marriage of two members of these families.

The Frederick German Reformed Church records show that Peter Brunner married Anna Maria Storm sister of Charlotte. The date was 1750. Peter was a son of Jacob Brunner. His wife was his mother's neice. They had a daughter Charlotte baptized March 27, 1754. When Joseph Doll and his wife Charlotte baptized their daughter Charlotte May 19, 1773 Charlotte Brunner was a witness.

George Smith married Catherine Storm, Charlotte's sister. When Joseph and Charlotte Doll had their son George baptized May 25, 1778 George Smith and Catherine were witnesses.

Peter Brunner and Anna Maria were again witnesses when Joseph and Charlotte Doll baptized their son Jacob April 2, 1780.

Michael Christ married Maria Elizabeth Storm another of Charlotte's sisters. When they baptized their son John Peter Christ in 1774 Joseph and Charlotte Doll were witnesses.

It would seem that the Storm girls were closely associated from the above church records showing their presence from time to time at important family events such as christenings. Three of Charlotte's sisters are named plus a daughter of one sister. This should be final proof that Charlotte Doll was born Charlotte Sturm.

Addenda for MARY MYERS DOLL

On the page WOMEN IN OUR DOLL ANCESTRY reference is made to MARY MYERS who married Jacob Doll, with the notation that further efforts would be made to get more facts on this ancestor. Those facts have now come to light and refute the assumptions made about Mary on page DOLL 9.

Credit for unlocking the door to the past concerning Mary is given to Mr. Edward E. Steiner of 6521 Darnall Road, Baltimore, Maryland. From his collection of old Frederick, Maryland records he sent me a receipt signed by Ann Maria Myer Doll and her husband, Jacob Doll, dated January 10, 1815 for one hundred forty pounds current money representing that portion of the estate of Christopher Myer left to Ann Maria Myer, his daughter, who was unmarried at the time her father made his will. More material from Mr. Steiner included a copy of the will of Christopher M. Moyer made on March 20, 1812. The name is spelled Moyer and Christopher signed with his mark. This will was entered for probate on October 25, 1814. Mr. Steiner also furnished copies of a number of pages from "The Genealogy of the Steiner Family" published in 1896 by Dr. Lewis H. Steiner and his son, Bernard Steiner, which gave something of the genealogy of Christopher Moyer and his wife, Anna Margaret. In all of this the name is spelled Moyer.

Mrs. Henry D. Blair of 359 Homeland Southway, Baltimore, Maryland agreed to search at the Maryland Historical Society Library in Baltimore and at the Hall of Records in Annapolis, Maryland for further material on this family. What follows is a combination of that supplied by both Mr. Steiner and Mrs. Blair.

Our account starts with Caspar Moyer whose wife was Anna Barbara. We have no maiden name for her. Nor do we have birth dates for either Caspar or Anna Barbara. We do not know when or where they were married. Caspar Moyer died in Frederick, Maryland in 1773 and his wife in 1789. Caspar Moyer was an immigrant from Germany. On July 28, 1746 he purchased a tract of land, part of Tasker's Chance, from Daniel Dulaney. This land was in Frederick County, Province of Maryland.

Our descent from Caspar and Anna Barbara Moyer is through their son, Christopher. His confirmation is recorded in the German Reformed Church in Frederick in 1754. From the custom of the times, this would indicate Christopher was born about 1740, but whether in Germany or America we do not know for certain.

Christopher Moyer married Anna Margaret Ramsburg. She was the daughter of Stephen Ramsburg and Catherine Brunner. Catherine was the daughter of Joseph Brunner and his wife, Catharine Elizabeth. The Brunners arrived with their family and son-in-law, Christian Getzendanner, at Philadelphia in September 1729.

MARY MEYER (continued)

It is interesting to note that Stephen Ramsburg bought "Mortality" from Daniel Dulaney on July 28, 1746. This was a 473 acre parcel, also part of Tasker's Chance. Stephen Ramsburg was born in Germany October 11, 1711, and died in Frederick March 7, 1789. The purchase of "Mortality" probably made Anna Margaret Ramsburg and Christopher Meyer neighbors. We have no data for their marriage. As to their deaths, we only know that the will of Christopher Meyer was brought in for probate on October 25, 1814, and that of his wife on December 2, 1825.

Our ancestor, Anna Maria Meyer, was born and raised on a farmstead known as Shiefferstadt. When Joseph Brunner arrived in Frederick County he purchased one thousand acres of land lying west of the present city of Frederick. In 1756 he built a stone residence which he called Shiefferstadt after his birthplace near Mannheim, Germany. This home still stands near the corner of Rosemont Ave. and West Second St. in Frederick. The house was designed to withstand Indian attacks. The walls are two and one-half feet thick, and the timbers hand hewn and pinned together with wooden pegs. Now, in 1974, the Frederick County Landmarks Foundation is seeking funds to purchase and restore this residence as a HISTORICAL LANDMARK.

MARY MEYER (continued)

Eventually Joseph Brunner divided his property between his four sons, and Elias received the portion on which the home stood. Christopher Meyer became the third owner of this house and farm in 1771 by purchase from his wife's uncle, Elias Brunner. When Christopher Meyer died his will specified that Shiefferstadt was to become the joint property of his sons John and Israel. This was concluded by a deed recorded in Frederick County January 20, 1821.

Anna Maria Meyer was twenty-six years of age when she married Jacob Doll. The German Church records show five children for this couple. Their first child, Daniel Doll, is our next ancestor. Jacob died in 1841, ~~but we have no record of Anna Maria's death.~~ No wills have been found for either one. Anna died Sept. 13, 1854

Our German Heritage comes from solid, hardworking, thrifty people. They had traveled from their Homeland in the Palatinate in Germany to Pennsylvania. Not being content to remain in the more settled part of the country, they made their way to new German neighborhoods developing in Maryland and Virginia. Here they could find new lands on which to settle among people of their own race. Frederick in the Province of Maryland was one such place. Here came the Brunners, Steiners, Millers, Ramsburgs, Meyers, Derrs, Cists, Storms, Getzendanners and many, many more. The village of Frederick was laid out after title to the land was transferred to the first settlers by Daniel Dulaney on July 28, 1746. One of their first projects was the construction of a Church in which they could worship after the manner to which they were accustomed. The records of this Church are the source of much valuable genealogical material. Too, the Civil records since the beginning have been carefully kept and preserved. These in turn contribute much valuable information for years even before the American Revolution. Since all these early Civil records are written in English in long hand, we find this the point at which the spelling of the old German names found its way into the English translation. Meyer was one such name, and except for the kindness of a stranger, this story may never have unfolded for the benefit of the descendants of Anna Maria Meyer and Jacob Doll.

Dear Mrs. Shaver:

I thought you might like to have a copy of the genealogy of the earlier Doll clan. I just received this from Willy Bickel of Bretten, Baden, West Germany. He is the one who sent me the original Doll material shown in the genealogy I sent you in 1983. It is remarkable that these records have survived all the turmoil in that part of the world in the last 400 years.

Unless you read German you may need a German-English dictionary to translate the civil status of the persons named. Bellheim is a town in the old Rhine Province of Pfalz and is probably not too far from Bretten. * means born, oo means married, and - means died. Since Martin Luther did not establish the Evangelical Reformed Church until the early 1500s these records go back almost to that time.

I hope is well with you and yours and that you can make copies of this material for your family connections.

The Enclosed charts of the ancestry of our Doll family were received in October 1985 from Willy Bickel of Bretten, Baden, West Germany. You will note that these references are all from German reformed Lutheran records. Martin Luther 1483-1546 formed the Lutheran Church not too many years before the earliest dates on these sheets. If we had older church records it is quite possible that our earlier ancestors were Roman Catholics.

I suggest you Xerox this enclosure and fasten it to the back of each chart so in the future it will serve as an explanation of why these names and dates were not included in the 1971 printing of the Doll genealogy.
