Sept. 2nd 1777

Dear Sir

yours of the 29th - last part & first instant
I have read & I have been out yesterday endeavoring
to engage Barley but met with little success
as the farmers have not had time yet to
thresh it out & I have given orders to
some millers to purchase what they
could at present get and shall immediately
send off to ~~London~~ Head Quarters to
be bought. I send off to ~~London~~ Head Quarters to
day likewise that which is in the Magazine,
as there are Waggon ready to load it.

for whiskey I have to pay 17/8 17/6 p.c. &
for Barley they ask 15/ for Bush. To Morrow

I expect to set out for Head Quarters and there
shall make enquiry of Coll. Blair if something

Camp Valley Forge Dec^r 29. 1777

I enclose you have a letter to the 2^d M^o Genl, copy
of which is inclosed to Mr Payne; who has orders to demand
a Brigade of Ten Waggon daily, to proceed on with flour
to Camp. I hope you will be able to load them as they
are raised, as the contrary His Excellency The Commander in
Chief will be informed of, and you must answer for the
consequences. Should it be out of your power to comply
with the above, send the Teams to Lancaster or Wrights Ferry
for Loading. For your own sake I hope you will be able
to comply with this order
